Department of Chicana/o and Latinx Studies

[MAS 260 Corridos: Music, Identity, Cultural Expressions, and Social Narratives in the Borderlands](#)

Through an interdisciplinary approach, this course examines the roots, evolution, and impact of *corridos* through popular musical genres in Mexico and among Mexican American communities. The course explores how these musical narratives document lived experiences, serve as historical records, and reflect critical social, political, and cultural issues. Students will analyze the role of these genres in identity formation, cultural resistance, and collective memory while considering their influence on contemporary struggles and movements. Through comparative analysis of historical and socio-political contexts and cultural criticism, students will engage with these musical traditions as dynamic forms of storytelling that challenge dominant narratives and amplify marginalized voices.

[PSCI 250 Issues in Contemporary American Politics](#)

This course examines contemporary American politics, analyzing institutions, rights, policy, media, polarization, and social movements while fostering critical analysis, informed debate, and connections between scholarly research and real-world events.

Credits: 3

Department of Community Health Education

[CH 569 Rural Community Health Systems, Leadership, and Advocacy](#)

This course examines the policies, structures, and partnerships that shape healthcare and public health delivery in rural communities. Students will integrate public health, nursing, and medical perspectives to analyze complex challenges, strengthen leadership skills, and develop evidence-based advocacy action plans for systems-level change.

Credits: 3

Offered: Generally offered Summer Annually

Prerequisite: (GPA-GR-3.0) and (CH 568 with a minimum grade of C)

Class Restriction: Exclude Freshman and Sophomore

[CSD 492 Internship in CSD](#)

Internship to provide students with professional experience in Communication Sciences and Disorders. S/U graded.

Credits: 1-3

Offered: Generally offered Fall and/or Spring Annually

Special Notes: 3.0 GPA in CSD coursework is required. Instructor consent required for enrollment.

Department of Accounting and Computer Information Systems

[BACS 301 Business Analytics Techniques and Applications](#)

This course provides an overview of Business Analytics and its role in contemporary business strategies. Topics include the integration of data analytics with decision-making, the use of analytical tools for data-driven insights, and the impact of analytics on organizational performance. The course will cover hands-on experience with industry-standard analytics tools, as well as the application of analytical strategies in various business contexts, including finance, marketing, and operations.

Credits: 3

Offered: Generally offered Spring Annually

Prerequisite: BACS 101 with a minimum grade of D-

Special Notes: BACS 301 cannot be retaken for credit if BACS 495 "Business Analytics" title was taken in Spring 2023 or Spring 2024 or Spring 2025.

Mutually Exclusive Course: Credit allowed for only one of these courses: BACS 301 and BACS 495

Class Restriction: Include Sophomore and Junior and Senior

Department of Music

[MUS 529 Choral Repertoire in Contemporary Contexts](#)

This course will broaden students' ability to select, evaluate, and teach diverse repertoire for choirs in a variety of educational and community contexts. Students will leave this course with practical tools to build meaningful concert programs that engage singers and audiences alike.

Credits: 2

Offered: Generally offered Fall, Spring, and/or Summer – Check with department/school for next offering

Class Restriction: Excluding Freshman, Sophomore

[MUS 545 Latinx Music: Styles, History, and Cultural Contexts](#)

Explores major music traditions from Latin America and U.S. Latinx communities, with emphasis on musical features, cultural identity, migration, race, and the social functions of music.

Credits: 3

Offered: Generally offered Fall, Spring, and/or Summer – Check with department/school for next offering

Class Restriction: Exclude Freshman and Sophomore

[MUS 563 Advanced Recording Techniques](#)

This is a project-based course and will further take you into the world of audio recording and mixing.

Credits: 2

Prerequisites: MUS 556 with a minimum grade of C

Level Restriction: Include GR
